Update from Scott

Dear Friends,

As most of you are all aware, the world for Lynda and I changed very dramatically on Wednesday, August 27 th. That's the day Lynda received a CT Scan report indicating concerning masses in her pancreas and spleen. Since that day, it's been a whirlwind of doctor visits, medical tests, and consults. Where it has ended is Duke University Hospital. In Monday, September 1, we came to Duke Hospital where Lynda was admitted so that she could have a stent placed in her bile duct which was being obstructed by the pancreatic mass. Since that procedure, Lynda has felt much better and is able to eat solid food.

What we are waiting for now is the conclusive pathology reports that will determine what kind of cancer we are dealing with and then the appropriate treatment for that cancer. As I write this, all of that is still unknown. It has been an emotional roller coaster since we've arrived at Duke. There have been at least four different specialists involved and a daily regimen of labs and Dr. visits that start around 6AM in the morning. Through it all, we have felt your prayers and your love. You have sent us texts, email, cards, and messages on social media reminding us of your love, care, and support, and it means so much to us. We can't thank you enough!

I have been staying with Lynda at the hospital so I can be available to help her as well as hear what the Doctor's are saying as well as ask my own questions. I've been able to make a couple of trips home to collect some items, fresh clothes, and check mail. As this journey progresses, we have no idea at this point what our schedule will entail. It's my intention to keep you as our faith community updated as much as possible. Our daughter, Erin, has set up a Caring Bridge site for folks to also check on updates that we have provided, and Erin also provides.

I also want to thank many of you for your willingness to "step in" as Lynda and I navigate the next few weeks. Karin Heller just came on staff in June and already she has been willing to take on extra roles such as offering the prepared message on Sunday morning. Nichole Looney, our Office Administrator, has been tremendous in managing the office and working with me long distance as we communicate via phone and computer. Also grateful for Willie and Carlene Davis as they manage the meetinghouse. And there are so many of you that are also offering your presence and willingness to assume a role or cover an area and step in to help. You are all tremendous and amazing!

We continue to welcome your prayers and your Loving Light. We miss being part of the regular rhythm of High Point Friends meeting life right now, and we look forward to when that can happen again.



Dear Friends of Good Will,

On August 25th, the Israeli army carried out an incursion just outside the Rahmallah Friends School gates. Explosions and gunfire were severe. For the safety of our students, staff immediately secured each building, moving children to the lower floors. Parents were notified by SMS that their children were safe.

The situation around the school was extremely dangerous. Tear gas canisters were fired into the area, making it very difficult for children and staff—especially those with allergies—to breathe. Snipers were positioned around the buildings, and alarmingly, a parent was fired upon when attempting to reach the school gates. Thankfully, she was able to reach safety

inside. A gas canister also landed on the balcony of the main administration building, though by grace no one was injured.

As of now, the military has withdrawn from the immediate area around the school. However, this remains a fluid and ongoing situation. The children are still shaken, families are anxious, and staff continue to exercise great caution in caring for those entrusted to them.

We ask Friends everywhere to continue to hold the students, families, and staff of Ramallah
