#### Welcome to October...and Quaketober!

"Some Christian groups ask, 'How can we be certain of our salvation?' Others wonder, 'How can we be sure we are right?' Still others inquire, 'How can we do good in the world?' The Quaker question, however, has been, 'How can we be – most radically and effectively – true followers of Jesus?' When this question is lived faithfully, the other questions tend to take care of themselves.'

(Paul Anderson, Following Jesus: The Heart of Faith and Practice)

Every first Sunday of October, the *Friends World Committee for Consultation* (FWCC) invites Quakers all over the world to participate in what is called "*World Quaker Day*". This is simply a way for Quakers – on one day – to celebrate their Quaker witness and share with one another how God is working through Quakers in each of the places we live and inhabit. This year, "*World Quaker Day*" will be Sunday, October 5th and the theme is "*Love Your Neighbor*". What we (High Point Friends Meeting) would like to do is not just focus on one Sunday, but all of October (hence the designation of "Quaketober!) The purpose is to give intentional focus during this month on our Quaker heritage and history as well as explore the important and unique gifts Quakers have to offer our world in it's present condition and time.

Quakers have a long history in this country and in North Carolina and one can spend hours (if not days) on researching Quaker history, ancestry, and cemeteries. And to be sure, there is nothing wrong with that for our foremothers and forefathers have much to teach us.



But I'm often leery of spending too much time in the past lest we forget that the Living Christ is a present reality who invites us to live faithfully in the way of Jesus in our present reality. When we don't have a vision for how to live in the present reality, we often gravitate towards the comfort of the past where it's easy to linger in a respectable past. I'm not sure that lingering in a respectable past is what we are called to be about. Rather, we are invited to ask the question, "How can we be – radically and effectively – true followers of Jesus?" in the present reality in which we find ourselves.

What I would like to invite all of us to become in this month of "Quaketober" is explorers in the way of Jesus. As we make discoveries and experience new landscapes, let's keep asking ourselves the question, "How does living in this way strengthen our Quaker witness and what does it mean to love our neighbor?" My hope is that this month will do more than just offer us more information on what Quakerism is all about (although there will be bits and pieces of information), but that we will also experience formation around the way of Jesus and the Quaker way. For if the Quaker Way is to be more than just a living museum, we will need to discover (and rediscover) what it means to be a vital and living movement of the Spirit in a way that speaks to the condition of our world. If we can do this, I feel we will certainly become spiritually relevant in a world that has often deemed spirituality irrelevant and out of touch. So, with that, welcome to Quaketober!




### Quaker Query/Advice of the Month



Friends United Meeting connects Friends with Quakers around the world in places such as Africa, Cuba, Jamaica, Ramallah, and Belize.
- Friends Committee on National Legislation (www.fcnl.org) Friends Committee on National Legislation (FCNL) advocates for lifegiving polices and legislation based on Quaker principles and the testimonies. Folks may connect with them at a personal level or whole Meetings may connect with FCNL.
- Friends World Committee for Consultation (www.fwccamericas.org) FWCC provides opportunities, resources, and gatherings for Quakers around the world to deepen their understanding of one another as well as strengthen the collective Quaker witness.
- Quaker Lake Camp (www.quakerlakecamp.org) This is the Quaker Camp in Climax, NC (not too far from High Point) where Summer camps are offered each year and the facilities can be rented by Quaker groups and local meetings for day events and retreats. The camp also offers other activities throughout the year such as the annual Pumpkin Festival and a Christmas Candlelight Worship.
