#### There Goes the Neighborhood

"The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood." (John 1:14, <u>The Message</u>)

Probably one of my favorite passages of scripture during the Advent and Christmas season is the one from the Gospel of John that reminds us of the miracle of the "incarnation". The word "incarnation" literally means "to become flesh". In the Common English Bible, it reads, "The Word became flesh and made his home among us." To paraphrase, The Message, reworks it a bit and reads, "The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood."

I love the way <u>The Message</u> paraphrases it because in my mind, the neighborhood is where life happens. Neighborhoods are the places in which you and I live. It's where we pay bills, deal with relationships, raise families as well as become "empty nesters" once the kids move out. Neighborhoods are where we welcome friends and family and it's also the places where we say goodbye to friends and family. Neighborhoods are where we celebrate as well as grieve, and neighborhoods are where we experience the different seasons of our life as well as the ups and downs of life. Neighborhoods are life and it's the stuff of life that others may not often see, but it's real for you and me.

Advent and Christmas invite us to pay attention to this miracle of the Divine coming to us and taking on human form and living with us. No longer is God's presence "out there" but, rather, with us in the very places in which we live. No longer do we have to separate our "spiritual life" from our "real life", but our "real life" is our spiritual life.



In other words, reality is spirituality and all of life becomes a sacred experience. God became flesh and moved into the neighborhood and God's presence lives with us in the very details of our life.

This also invites us, if you will, to "incarnate" God's love to the neighborhoods in which we live. One of the phrases I often connect with High Point Friends is that we are here to "make God's love real". This "making God's love real" is simply being God's living presence and love in the neighborhoods in which we live and exist. High Point Friends is situated right in the middle of a neighborhood, and this is the very place we are called to dwell and "make God's love real". Rather than it being a liability, maybe our greatest asset as a Quaker meeting is that we are located in a neighborhood, and that we can be the very place that disconnected and lonely folks can find community, love, and a place of belonging.

In this way, Christmas for us, as Quakers, is an everyday experience. God becoming flesh and moving into the neighborhood is an everyday reality. We may pay more attention to it during the Season of Advent and Christmas, but the reality of it lives on beyond the Christmas season. Maybe, then, the greatest gift we can offer the neighborhoods in which we exist is that of making God's love real to these we meet and encounter.




#### Quaker Query/Advice of the Month

This year, we will be recognizing the season of Advent as part of our worship. Advent is actually the beginning of the Church Calendar and the Christian Year. Where our regular calendars are pointing to the end of the year, Advent is the start of the Church Calendar. It's a season that moves us deeper into darkness even as we put out candles and Christmas lights. The darkness invites us into deeper reflection and wondering and even questions. Author Diana Butler Bass describes it this way, "Advent is twinned with the winter solstice. We are exiles in time, wandering still in the wilderness, and following start toward dreams of a better world that we can never quite reach...As night lengthens, Christians light a single candle every week against the shadows of fear, doubt, despair, and hatred." And that is what we will do. Each Sunday we will light a candle as part of our meeting for worship as we look to the Eternal Light in our seasons of doubt and despair.

Each Sunday there will be a one-word theme for each candle and we will provide prompts for you during the week that provides spiritual practices for you to fully participate in Advent as you feel led. We hope you will join us for worship during this special time of year and that Advent can be a meaningful journey for you.





# Our quarterly Meeting for Business was held on Sunday, November 26, after meeting for worship, Here is a summary of items that were approved and discussed.

- A 2026 Budget was approved. Please contact the office at office@highpointfriends.org if you would like a copy.
- <u>Nichole Looney Office Administrator</u> has been creating partnerships and connections with West End Ministries and Senior Resources of Guilford County for our meeting to be engaged in outreach and service through giving. We will also be receiving on a regular basis canned food items/nonperishables to donate to West End Ministries Food Pantry.
- <u>Friends United Meeting (FUM)</u> is in the midst of a financial challenge. There are many positive things happening in and through Friends United Meeting. In order to do that, they are in the midst of a significant fundraising campaign to raise \$650,000 by the end of December of this year. **High Point Friends recently gave a contribution of \$10,000 to Friends United Meeting to help with their financial needs**.
- <u>House & Grounds</u> Significant drainage work around the meetinghouse grounds has been completed. The HVAC unit between the Music Room and Kitchen is in need of repair and will be repaired within the month. The Meeting will be seeking estimates/proposals on the trimming and pruning of the trees in the main front yard area and around the main parking areas.
- A Visioning and Planning Day for High Point Friends will happen on either Saturday, January 31 or Saturday, February 7. This will be from 9AM 12 Noon. This will be a time of looking back over the past year as well as looking forward to the year ahead as we dream, plan, and seek to be faithful to the gifts we have been given.
- <u>70th Anniversary of Dedication of the Meetinghouse</u> October 2026 marks 70 years since the dedication of the Meetinghouse we presently gather in. We will be forming a "working group" of folks to help plan events and focus for October 2026 to help us celebrate this milestone.
- <u>"Reimagine High Point Friends"</u> In our January/February "visioning and planning day", we will form a "Reimagine High Point Friends" committee/working group that will meet to discern, dream, and discover what a new future looks like for High Point Friends Meeting as we build on our present growth and our past history.
